# **Chapter Spotlight**



**Epsilon Xi chapter** at Salisbury University – albeit a relatively new chapter – has quickly established itself as an accomplished one. Since 2017, the chapter has won numerous national chapter awards as well as individual members winning the Founder's Award and Gamman of the Year Award. Our chapter continues to be active on campus and in our community.

- In Spring 2023, two Gammans attended the SOPHE conference in Atlanta, GA in 2023. One of these students presented a poster titled "Understanding HIV Criminalization Through the Social Determinants of Health."
- Over the past few semesters, the chapter hosted numerous tabling events on campus to provide information and resources to students, faculty, and staff on topics including stress management, menu planning on a budget, reproductive health, mental health, and healthy relationships.
- Every year, the chapter hosts an "Alumni Afternoon" networking event where an alumn from the program talks to current students about careers, credentialing, and graduate school.
- Every year, the chapter teaches a lesson on sexually transmitted infection, called STI Mythbusting, in their general education wellness course. In doing so, they are able to reach an average of 200 undergraduate students a semester.



- Every spring, the chapter forms a Relay for Life team. The 2023 team sold succulent plants on campus and donated all proceeds to the American Cancer Society. Gammans also made Cancer Care Packages made from items our chapter members donated.
- Every year the chapter gives back to their local Life Crisis Center by holding a fundraiser and donating 100% of proceeds to this important community organization.
- The chapter continues to be active in other fundraising efforts, such as annual Custom Ink tshirt fundraisers and volunteering for Seagull Century, the bike race on the Eastern shore of Maryland that is held every October. This fundraising allows the chapter to sponsor a CHES exam scholarship every semester that is awarded to applicants who are in good standing. For the fall 2023 semester, they were able to sponsor a total of 5 students' CHES registration fee!



We continue to move forward with planning to meet back together at SOPHE In St. Louis! We have planned Monday, March 18 to be an ESG day, with planned activities, annual business meeting, and our awards ceremony occurring on the 18th. Watch for more Information coming early next year. Also, a reminder that we have expanded the <u>travel scholarship</u> to assist student members attend the conference. I encourage you to nominate yourself or others for one of the numerous national individual awards.

In addition, I would like to announce the establishment of the Judith K. Luebke Membership Scholarship, made available from a memorial gift from Judy and her family, to support the cost of annual ESG membership dues for student members facing extreme financial barriers. Judy was a long-time supporter of ESG and professional preparation of students, and we are honored to be able to continue her legacy in supporting students.
